Emergency Management Committee

The purpose of the EMC is to identify potential emergency management issues facing Surfside; assess their potential seriousness, frequency and likelihood; identify means for protecting Surfside lives and property from loss or damage; develop recommendations for Surfside members to protect their health and safety; identify measures Surfside can take to protect lives and property in the event of emergencies; work cooperatively with federal, state, and local emergency management agencies and resources; assess the effectiveness of emergency management at all levels; and make improvements.

The Emergency Management Committee (EMC) meets the last Tuesday of the month at 1:00 p.m. in the business office.

Safety and Security Committee

The purpose of this committee is to conduct periodic safety and security inspections of Surfside HOA property and buildings, recreational areas and community facilities.

Work collaboratively with other committees, volunteers, and staff to fulfill these duties.

Evaluate road safety of the Surfside Community to control traffic, speeding, pedestrian walkways, and reentry into traffic from beach trails.

Consider, investigate, or take action, at the direction of or delegation by the BOT, matters or subjects pertaining to Surfside community safety and security.

Provide updates to the community Association website/newsletter concerning the actions of the Committee related to Community Safety and Security

Contact and provide reports on any safety issues in our community to Surfside compliance representatives.

Review and provide contract recommendations to the Board of Trustees for approval, that would engage the Sherriff to provide Services covering Surfside HOA members within the Surfside property borders to the Board of Trustees for approval.

The committee meets at 3:00 PM on the third Thursday of the month in the Business Office.



Plan on installing a fence, a shed, a gazebo or building a garage or a house?

REMINDER...

ALL building plans must be submitted to the Architectural Committee <u>prior</u> to any construction.

Pacific County will not approve permitting until the committee has signed off on all plans.

The committee meets every Tuesdays at 9 a.m. at the business office. The plans MUST be submitted by Friday at noon to be added to the next week's agenda. The building packets are on our website at surfsideonline.org/forms/ or you can pick them up from the business office.

Please notify the business office if you want to attend the meeting in person.

If you are building on a vacant lot without an address, please post a sign so the committee knows which lot will be developed.

Two (2) sets of plot plans must be submitted to the committee. Once approved, you will get a copy of the approved plan. Take it to the county for their approval as needed. Surfside will retain one set of approved plans to keep on file.
