Mike is employed by the Sherriff's Office, not by the Surfside HOA.

He currently works Saturday through Wednesday and is doing patrols through all streets in Surfside. He is living in Ocean Park and he is very knowledgeable about Surfside. He is excited to get re-connected to our community. If you see him, you are always welcome to wave and say hello to him.

We are reinstating the "Patrol Service" for Surfside members. If you leave your home for a certain period of time, you are welcome to come to the HOA office and fill out a "Patrol Service" form. This form will be given to Deputy Mike Ray and he will watch you property, check your house, doors and windows.

If a crime occurred, please call the Pacific County Sheriff's department and report it. Please call the non-emergency phone number (360)-642-9397. They will take your information.

In case of an emergency or if you experience a violent crime, immediately call 911! An officer will be dispatched.

Please do not call the Surfside HOA Office. The office has no authority to respond or dispatch an officer!



## SURFSIDE AREA NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH





#### Water Turn On Service

If you need your water turned on for the summer season, give us a call during regular business hours and put in a request. A member of our water department staff will go to your house or lot and turn on your water at the meter. This service is **free of charge**. Call 360-665-4171.

#### Summer RV Season is starting March 15th

It's almost here! The summer RV season is upon us and that means sun, fun, and permits. If you plan to bring your RV back to your home at the beach, please stop by the office and get a conditional use permit and register your stay. Permits will not be sent via email, but we can arrange to leave them for you to pick up after hours.

The summer use permit is good from March 15th to October 31st (2.9a.1) The **permit must be prominently displayed and visible from the street** (2.9a).



In addition to being a covenant, permits are a safety

measure ensuring only owners and their guests are parked on a lot and not squatters. And remember, all RVs must be registered, licensed, and maintained in a mobile condition at all times (2.9a). Enjoy your time at the beach!





# **ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE**

Plan on installing a fence, a shed, a gazebo or building a garage or a house? REMINDER...

# ALL building plans must be submitted to the Architectural Committee <u>prior</u> to any construction.

Pacific County will not approve permitting until the committee has signed off on all plans.

The committee meets every Tuesdays at 9 a.m. at the business office. The plans MUST be submitted by Friday at noon to be added to the next week's agenda. The building packets are on our website at <u>surfsideonline.org/forms/</u> or you can pick them up from the business office.

Please notify the business office if you want to attend the meeting in person.

If you are building on a vacant lot without an address, please post a sign so the committee knows which lot will be developed.

**Two (2) sets of plot plans must be submitted to the committee.** Once approved, you will get a copy of the approved plan. Take it to the county for their approval as needed. Surfside will retain one set of approved plans to keep on file.

Download the Operations Manual and the Surfside Restrictive Covenants or call the business office 360-665-4171 with questions.
